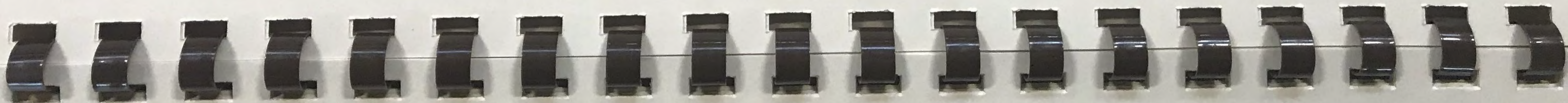

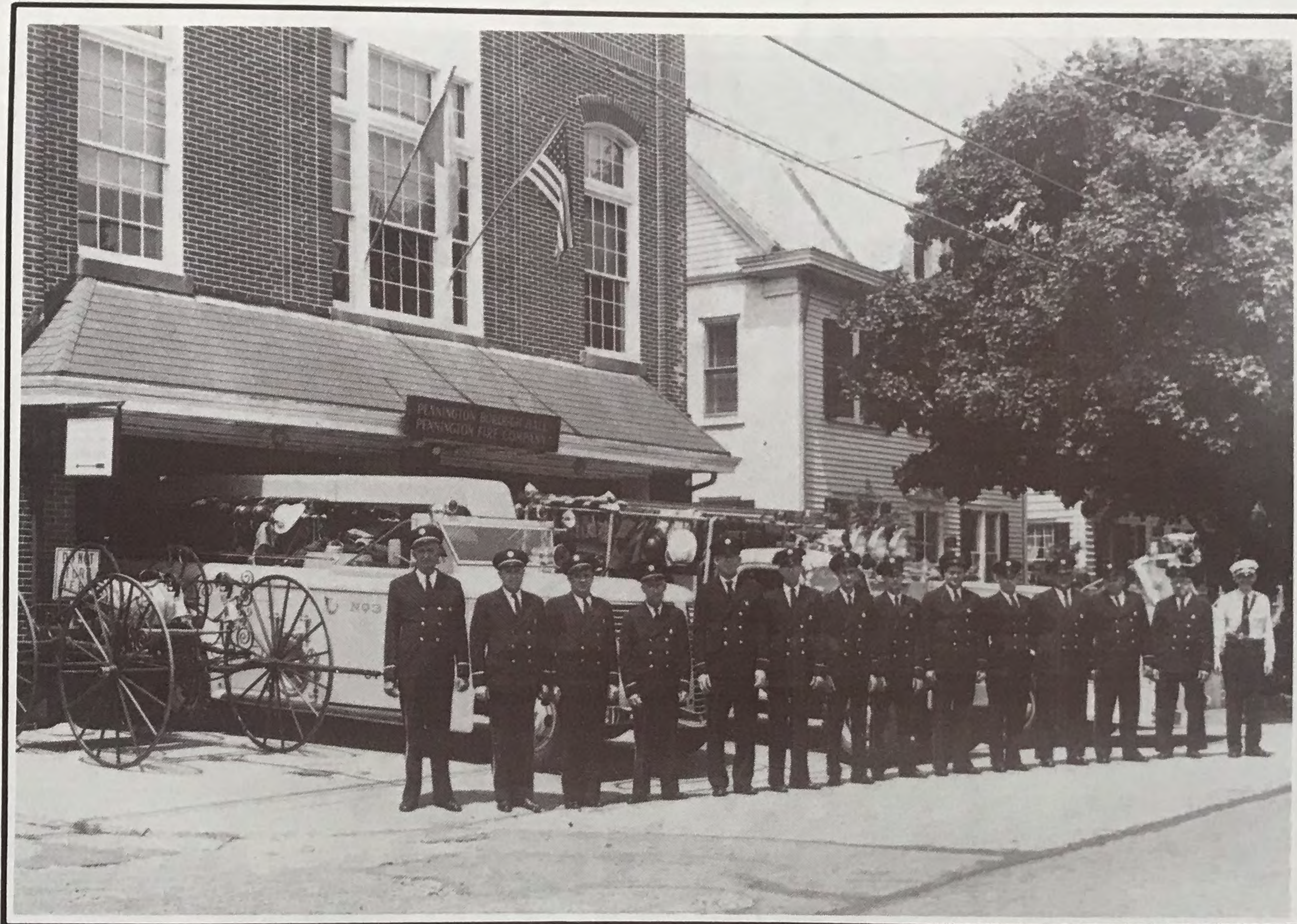

led the parade for many years.

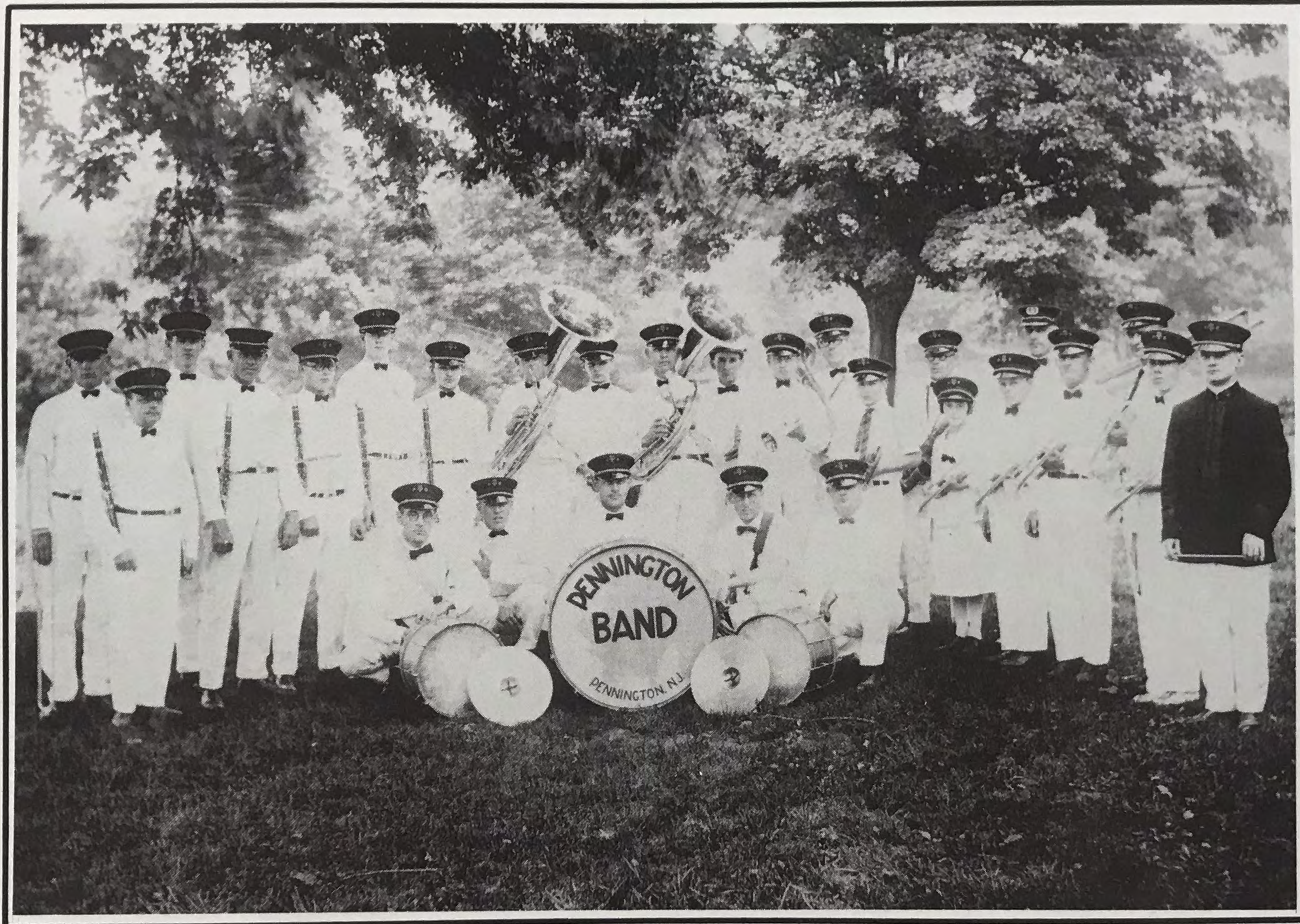




This aerial view from 1920 shows The Pennington School property in the foreground.
